New counseling services offered at Duchesne

The Community and Children's Resource Board (CCRB) of St. Charles County is now offering a free counseling service to our Duchesne families.

Our CCRB counselor is Emily Brennan, a licensed professional counselor (LPC) in Missouri, who works for Chestnut Health Systems. Emily has been working as a therapist for six years and has experience in emergency mental health, outpatient care, and schoolbased services. She works with kids with a variety of different issues, including anxiety, depression, self-harm, history of trauma, or problems at home and at school.

"I am really passionate about making sure kids have an outlet to talk about the things they have going on in their



lives and receive the support that they need and deserve," Emily said. "The partnership we have at Duchesne is a really cool opportunity to provide therapy resources at no cost to students during the school day so that they don't have to worry about finding outside therapy or arranging transportation to after-school appointments."

These services are supported by a grant funded by the St. Charles County CCRB. This grant covers the cost of an insurance copay, so there is no out-of-pocket cost for therapy. If a student (or parent!) is interested in these services, please contact me to set up an intake appointment and begin services.

Vanco RevTrak: This new payment system offers a secure and convenient way to manage your child's meal payments. With Vanco Rev Trak, you can easily make payments online, set up automatic payments, and monitor your transaction history. This system is designed to streamline the payment process, ensuring that your child always has funds available for meals. Deposits can be made in any amount up to \$500 with a \$2.50 fee per transaction. See the attached flyer for detailed instructions and support.

Meal Magic: Our new account details system, Meal Magic, provides a user-friendly platform to keep track of your child's meal account. You can view account balances and

transaction histories, and receive notifications about low balances. If applicable, a parent/guardian will be able to preorder meals, restrict purchases, set daily spending limits and other new features. Meal Magic is designed to give you peace of mind by keeping you always informed of your child's meal account status. 

What is Meal Magic Family Portal?

Meal Magic Family Portal combines features that previously were available elsewhere but required you to visit multiple websites. Now, all food service activity can be accessed through a single site.

You can use Family Portal to view balances, see account and purchase histories, make deposits, transfer money among family members, set parental controls, apply for meal benefits, complete household information reports, and order meals. Some schools might not offer all of these features.

Registration Tips

Before registering, add *.familyportal.cloud as a safe domain email sender in your email app. If you think you did not receive an email, try looking in your spam folder. If it's there, be sure to mark it as safe for future email messages.

If you get a message about not being able to access your account, try using the I forgot my passphrase option under My Account.

Registering (Creating an Account)

Each school district has its own Family Portal web address. You will need to create an account at each one you need to access. No information is shared between districts.

Registering an account has two parts. In the first part, you will be asked to enter your email address and agree to the site's Terms of Use and Privacy Policy, after which an email will be sent to you.

Email is sent to confirm that you have access to the address you used. If you click the link that is in the email, you will be returned to Family Portal to complete the second part of registration, which entails entering your real name and setting a passphrase to protect your account.

Registrations must be completed within 20 minutes. If you take too long, you will need to click the I need to unlock my account option.

- Click My Account.
- 2. Click I need to register as a Family Portal user.
- 3. Enter your email address for the Username.
- 4. Click Next.
- 5. Read and **Accept** the Terms of Use and Privacy Policy.
- Check your email for activation instructions.
- 7. Click the link in the activation email.
- 8. Enter your first and last name and set a passphrase.
- 9. Click Submit.

Important Note About Passphrases

A passphrase is like a password but usually is longer and has fewer restrictions on format. Your passphrase will be tested against a database of passwords known to have been compromised on other websites and will be rejected if a match is found.

For security, **never** use the same passphrase on more than one website, and **never** share your passphrase with anyone, including your district or our support team. Treat it as highly confidential.

My Account

After successfully completing registration, you will use **My Account** whenever you want to access your account.

If you have forgotten your passphrase, enter your Username and click I forgot my passphrase.

Adding Family Members / Pending Approvals

When logged into Family Portal, you will have the ability to add family members to your account by using the **Add Person** button. Minimally, you will need to know the ID Number assigned by the school to the person along with the person's first and last name.

Before you can access information for a person attached to your account, your school district must approve your access to them. Once approved, you will be able to see balances, settings, and histories.

Removing Family Members

To remove a family member using a smart device, swipe left on the member's name and then click the trashcan icon. On a PC, hover your mouse over the name to reveal the trashcan.

Adding Money for Family Members

When you are logged into your account, click the **Deposit** button when you want to add money for family members. Enter an amount for each person you want to give money and then click **Check-Out** to see your payment options. Click the payment method you want to use, provide the requested information, and click the **Pay** button.

Transfer Money, See History, Change Settings

Touch or click a family member on the **My Account** page if you want to transfer money from that person to another on your account, or if you want to view account history including purchases, or if you want to set parental controls (if allowed by the district).

Low-Balance Reminder Email

If you would like to receive email notifications when a family member's account balance is running low, click the Notifications button on the My Account screen. Uncheck the first box if it is checked, and then check the second box. Set a dollar amount (\$0, \$5, \$10, \$15, \$20 ... up to \$50). An email will be sent when a balance reaches or goes below the amount you set. Reminders repeat every three days as necessary.

Click the **How-To Videos** button if you want to view videos about using Family Portal.

More Information and Who to Call for Help

Your information is saved with your school's private data and is not accessible by Meal Magic Corporation. Our support team cannot view your account, or any person connected to it. You must contact your school if you have questions about your family members.

Money does not flow through Meal Magic Corporation. You must contact your district about duplicate payments, refunds, or anything related to account balances. Each school district is independent of others and, therefore, is unable to transfer balances to other school districts

For your protection, no credit card or banking information is stored by Meal Magic Family Portal.



From Duchesne to the United States Space Force

or Pioneer graduates, the time spent at Duchesne prepares them for higher learning and equips them with all the necessary skills to help their post-high school life take off. For Alex Kleitz '19, the expression is a bit more literal.

This United States Space Force (USSF) 2nd Luitenant is currently stationed at Schriever Airforce Base in Colorado Springs as a part of the 4th Space Operations Squadron tasked with operating military satellite communications systems.

The USSF is the military wing that focuses primarily on space-based weaponry, providing intelligence to the military, and counter space applications such as destroying enemy satellites.

"I've pretty much always wanted to go into the service academy since I was 10 or 11," said Kleitz. "It is a very competitive, intense admissions process, and Duchesne really set me up well for success there and success later on down the line."

Kleitz spent his time at Duchesne soaking up every opportunity it offered. Whatever came up, he'd be a part of it. Science Olympiad? Yes. Scholars Academy? Yes. The first captain of Jogues House? Yes. The list goes on. Did we mention he also played music in the jazz band and musicals? He aimed to experience as much as he could

to broaden his education as much as possible, and learning the multitasking skills necessary to succeed in all of these subjects helped prepare him for life beyond high school.

After graduating from Duchesne, Kleitz set out for basic training and service academy—the first year consisting of learning rules and expectations, not to mention doing plenty of push-ups.

The academic load is heavy, with more than 135 hours of core classes before courses focusing on your major. Cadets build and operate spacecraft on behalf of the Department of Defense (DOD) and are given the opportunity to fly aircraft and space-

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craft and perform experiments for the National Reconnaissance Office and Air Force Research Laboratory.

During his senior year at the academy, Kleitz was the commander of a squadron of 150, ensuring all those under his supervision were adequately trained. He graduated from officer undergraduate training at Vandenberg Space Force Base, where he studied weapons systems as well as allied and adversary warfare tactics.

That's a lot to accomplish by the age of 22, and Kleitz stresses that he gained the core skills used to get there from his days as a Pioneer.

"What Duchesne really provided for me was a place where I could begin practicing those leadership skills and also practicing just taking on the amount of work that would prepare me for the academy," he said. "I could be a captain of one of the houses, I could also be in the band, and I could also be the captain of the track team and the cross country team. I could just take on a lot of stuff. I think if I'd gone to a different school, I'd have been siloed into a specific role. You're in the band, or you're on the track team. I was able to do basically everything I wanted, whatever

the opportunities were. It's not something you get at most schools."

Kleitz credits several Duchesne faculty for influencing him, such as his then-history teacher Bob Biehle. Kleitz said Mr. Biehle showed him what a love of history could become through serious study. Mr. Biehle's current events class is why Kleitz became interested in nuclear weapons and decided to pursue the subject as his minor.

What's next for Kleitz? After becoming proficient with the military satellite communications systems, he wants to continue to hone his leadership skills. Air Force Weapons School and getting a Master's in Systems Engineering are also on the horizon.

Students interested in a career in the USSF can find a wealth of information at https://www.spaceforce.com/. Kleitz also recommends reading "Space Warfare" by John Klein.

His last piece of advice is applicable, no matter what future DHS graduates want to study post-high school.

"Keep up with the news, read, be involved in school, and you'll set yourself up for success," he said.




