When I returned home from the parent information meeting for our newest students, I did what any middle-aged mom would do... I got into bed and started scrolling through my social media pages. Ironically, I came upon this post written by a parent of a freshman in high school. The thought struck me as I read line after line, "This is exactly how our parents are feeling right now!" Transitioning to high school can be challenging for everyone... but remember – you are not alone. Below is the post. I believe it's worth the read!

Watching teens grow up is like sitting in the bleachers for their most important game of all: Life.

And it stinks and is amazing all at the same time.

I was watching an NFL pre-season game with my boys when the commentator said something interesting. The camera panned to one of the players moms, her expression tense and focused. You could see her jumping out of her seat when he did well and cheering with her whole heart. Holding his stress (and hers) in the grip on her seat

and the set of her jaw when he didn't. The commentator said something like, "Moms of athletes really carry a lot. They're feeling everything from the sidelines." And we are. Whether they're in peewee or high school, college or professional. What our athletes may never fully understand, but all moms and dads do, is that no one will ever love them the way we do. Maybe they'll love them as much, but not in the same way.

Last night I was watching my son out on the field for his first scrimmage of the season, and it occurred to me, parents have these seats in the bleachers for more than just sports. We're watching our teens run out on the field in more ways than one. We're watching them grow up and dog-gone-it, these aren't always our favorite seats. Sometimes we wish we could just jump in there with them, but we also know we can't. So we sit here, holding our breath, praying our hearts out, gripping the seat and clinching our jaw as we watch them become young men and women.

There was a time when we were out there with them, holding their hands, tying their shoes, picking them up when they scratched their knees. It was our job to stand between them and danger and we took that job more seriously than we've taken any job before.


And now here we are in the stands, actively letting go with our hearts in our throats. Praying they make good choices, praying they're resilient, praying they're strong, praying they're okay.

And it's agony. Actual agony.

And it's also the best thing we've ever gotten to do. The very best thing. And that's the mess of it. The beautiful, crazy, agonizing mess of it. Parenting is the hardest thing I've ever done, and it's the absolute best...in the exact same minute.

So, I just want to remind you, as one parent to another... We parents are carrying a lot. A whole lot. We're feeling every single thing from our seats in the bleachers. And at least we can remember as we sit here in this rollercoaster of emotions...at least we're in it together.







Learning to use your voice

An alum's journey from Duchesne to LA

f you watch Dateline NBC, play Disney games on Alexa, or even catch one of those crazy mattress commercials, there's a chance the voice reaching your ears belongs to Duchesne grad Tim Powers '87. From his home recording set-up in western New York, Tim has done voice-over work for clients ranging from PBS to Netflix. He has taught students all over the country a truth he picked up on his journey: a career in voice-acting is much more than just reading a script — it's acting with a capital "A."

In his early days, Tim was heavily interested in radio. He listened to the DJs on stations like KSHE 95 FM and KXOK 630 AM, infatuated with these people who got paid to play records, crack jokes, have a good time, and get paid for it. As someone who saw himself as a bit of a class comedian, this was right up his alley.

Duchesne offered Tim a chance to begin using his voice, whether making announcements or taking speech and acting classes. However, he admits he did not always take direction from his teacher seriously.

"I was not receptive to what she was trying to teach... like many teenage boys are, I thought I knew everything,



and there was nothing she could teach me," he said. "In retrospect, I learned the importance of being coachable because, over the following 30 years, I had to relearn everything this very sweet

woman was trying to get across to me."

Two years after graduation, Tim found himself at Lindenwood University, enrolled in a radio broadcasting and

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production class, and at 19, became the program director for KCLC Radio.

However, soon, Tim began to consider a change in direction for his career. There wasn't much money to be made in terrestrial radio. Personalities like Howard Stern were the exception, not the rule. Today, with station syndication, it's even more challenging to make a living. It was time to move on.

Over the next few years, Tim became involved stand-up comedy and improvisational theatre at Union Station in St. Louis. It's there that he found a passion for acting. LA came calling, and at 31, with \$700 in his pocket, he moved to California to start a new life.

He gained experience studying improv at the legendary Groundlings Theatre and the Upright Citizens Brigade, famous launching points for SNL stars such as Will Ferrell and Amy Poehler, respectively. He was learning the fundamentals that his acting teacher had tried to instill in him years before.

One night at a party, while doing funny voices over a muted TV with some friends, Tim was approached by a man who recognized his talent for voices. The stranger turned out to be a director at Disney, and encouraged him to seek a voice-acting career. Tim recognized this as a chance to dig in and learn the craft from a new mentor. He recorded a demo, got some coaching, and began recording on the lot in Burbank.

He also voice acting importance skills and coachable.

Looking esne, Tim more oper acting teach many of his in his care.

Since then, Tim has done dubbing for Netflix, voiced characters for the Final Fantasy and Call of Duty video games, and built a reputation of being reliable and good at what he does.

Like many, when the pandemic hit, he realized he could work from anywhere in the country. He now records in New York state, in a home studio that is a simple walk-in closet with walls lined with moving blankets, a microphone, and a computer. He records auditions in the morning and works on current projects in the afternoon.

He also teaches online courses in voice acting and improv, stressing the importance of honing good acting skills and having the humility to be coachable.

Looking back at his time at Duchesne, Tim chuckles that if he'd kept a more open mind and listened to his acting teacher, he would have acquired many of his present skills much earlier in his career. It's an excellent reminder to all students to pay attention in class, or you might miss out on something that could give you a real edge in life.







