

Duchesne Hockey - Division Locked, History Still Being Made

There are three games remaining in the regular season, but with an undefeated 14-0-3 record, the 2024-25 Duchesne Pioneer Ice Hockey Team has already locked up the St. Charles Division Title in the Mid-States Conference. For this Pioneer team, though, that does not mean pumping the brakes - not even a little.

On Friday Night, Jan. 10, Duchesne took on Francis Howell Central and it was also Duchesne's Senior Night where five hockey seniors and three hockey cheer seniors were recognized prior to the game.

Just a week before this game, Duchesne embarrassed St. Dominic on their Senior Night with an 8-0 shutout win, so they knew they did not want to give their outgoing seniors anything less than a victory. In fact, they wanted to give them something to remember always. The game did not disappoint.

Going into the third period, Duchesne led by only one goal as Central had put up a valiant fight for two full periods. Max Hackmann, Ryan Adkerson, and Nick Morgan had put up three goals through those two periods to give Duchesne a 3-2 lead going into the third. But it was Team Captain Carson Kuhn's goal with 10:14 left in the game that put the Pioneer's up by two goals and motivated teammates Hudson Bomerschein, and Trenton Gebben-Thompson to score three more unanswered goals to make the final score 7-2 when the buzzer sounded.

What made the game even more exciting was the turnout from the student population of Duchesne High School. It was perhaps one of the largest student turnouts since the Wickenheiser Cup Championship

in 2020. Those students got to see a game that had a little bit of everything - big goals, big saves, a very rare penalty shot, and even a few big fights.

Already the best regular season record in Duchesne Ice Hockey history, there is still more history that the team would like to make. For starters, with three regular season games left, the team would like to continue making history with three more wins. To do so, they will need to notch those three victories over the course of four days - Jan. 21 versus Holt, Jan. 23 versus MICDS, and Jan. 24 versus Ft. Zumwalt East. That final game will take place at 7:45pm at the St. Peter's RecPlex.

The other history that could be made by the end of the season is the single-season points record. Currently, Duchesne alumni Vinny Conti ('19) holds the record with 59 points (41 goals, 18 assists) during the 2018-19 season. Senior Nick Morgan, with three games and playoff games still remaining, sits at 50 points (39 goals, 11 assists). With his nearly 3 point per game average, Duchesne fans could get to witness history in any of the upcoming games.

Morgan But isn't doing this alone. Out of 795 registered hockey players in the Mid-States Conference, Duchesne currently boasts the Top 3 scorers and a fourth player in the Top 25. Freshman Owen Kelsey currently sits at 45 points (18 goals, 27 assists) and leads all of Mid-States in assists. Senior Trenton Gebben-Thompson has worked his was to the #3 spot with 39 points (17 goals, 22 assists), and Senior Carson Kuhn sits in the Top 25 at the 24th spot with 22

points (9 goals, 13 assists). The most any other team has is two players in the Top 25 in points.

Defensively, Duchesne continues to dominate under the leadership of Senior Lucas Daleo who is also the points leader on the team defensively with 11 points (3 goals, 8 assists). Junior Ryan Adkerson has also been a key contributor defensively with six assists this season.

In the net, Duchesne continues to dominate with three goalies who all currently have over a 90% save percentage and a combined Goal Against Average of 2.53 through 17 games. Juniors Dillon Kuhn, Quinn Meyer, and freshman Braylon Douglas have all performed solidly in the net all season and offer that last bit of insurance when the puck makes it to them.

There is one statistic, however, that Duchesne sits at the bottom of the conference in - penalty minutes. With the exception of SLU High School, Duchesne has the second to last number of penalty minutes

Robotics Team takes 3rd at Hazelwood East competition

The 2024-2025 FIRST* Tech Challenge (FTC) season, themed "INTO THE DEEP" and presented by RTX, challenges teams to explore underwater-inspired environments through robotics. This season emphasizes innovation, STEM skills, and environmental awareness.

Team Spotlight: Duchesne Pioneers (Team #23622)


The Duchesne Pioneers are in their second season of FTC competition. Their journey through the "INTO THE DEEP" season has been marked by participation in three key events:

1. IWA Meet @ 8am (December 7, 2024)

At the Incarnate Word Academy Meet, the Pioneers engaged in six qualification matches, achieving victories in three:

Qualification Match 1: Secured a win with a score of 25-19 against teams 11514 and 2867.

Qualification Match 8: Triumphed with a 26-18 score alongside team 2867 against teams 16939 and 26519.

Qualification Match 12: Edged out a close victory, scoring 27-25 against teams 14690 and 16939.

These performances demonstrated the team's growing proficiency and strategic awareness.

2. Hazelwood East Meet @ 10am (December 21, 2024)

The Pioneers continued to showcase their skills in six

matches at Hazelwood East High School:

Qualification Match 3: Achieved a commanding win with a score of 83-23 against teams 7424 and 16939.

Qualification Match 15: Concluded the event on a high note, securing a 107-28 victory against teams 7424 and 26519.

These successes highlighted the team's effective collabora-

tion and technical enhancements.

3. Duchesne Meet @ 8am (January 4, 2025)

Hosting our own meet, the Pioneers participated in six matches, achieving notable victories:

Qualification Match 3: Dominated with a 213-41 win against teams 5108 and 21984.

Qualification Match 11: Secured a 152-109 victory alongside team 23424 against teams 5108 and 14963.

Hosting the event provided the Pioneers with a platform to exhibit their leadership and organizational capabilities.

Looking Ahead

The Duchesne Pioneers are set to compete in the STL North League Tournament on January 18, 2025. With each event, they have demonstrated growth in technical skills and strategic execution, embodying the core values of FIRST* and the spirit of innovation.

out of 35 Mid-States teams with just 96 penalty minutes.

All of these positive statistics come from two other statistics that are not measurable - confidence and teamwork. In years past, when this team would get down by a goal or two, they lacked the confidence to get themselves back into the game. That is not the case this season as they have been down in the goal count on several occasions but have always managed to come back in each

case. And the teamwork shows through the shared scoring. To have the Top 3 scorers in the league proves that nobody on this team is selfish when they get the puck. The goal is to win - period. And that is exactly what this team is doing.

STEM students take a virtual space station tour



STEM students now have the opportunity to experience the expanse of space and explore the secrets of the nano world, all without leaving the classroom.

The Oculus Meta Quest 2 is a VR headset purchased in part by a 2023 STEM grant, and will be a new staple of STEM and anatomy courses at Duchesne.

The headset fully immerses students in a 3D virtual world where they can carry out experiments on the International Space Station, study DNA and other molecules, and even complete activities such as building robotic hands.

We are still welcoming donations of live and silent auction items or cash donations to go toward purchasing items. Thank you for your continued support!







Information for Eligible Schools



WHAT SHOULD SCHOOLS DO NEXT?

Review Your Enrollment

Review current academic year enrollment for qualifying students.

- Elementary schools: focus on income-eligible kindergarten and 1st grade classes and transfer students -or- qualifying special needs students (IEP/ISP).
- High Schools: focus on income eligible transfers from public schools (9-12) -or- special needs students (IEP/ISP).

Develop Guidance for Tuition Payment

Scholarship funds from this program are directly administered to *families*. Schools should consider developing guidance for families as it pertains to accepting MOScholars scholarship payment to cover tuition/registration fees.

What is MOScholars?

\$6,375 renewable scholarships for eligible K-12 students.

Who is eligible for MOScholars?

All Missouri residentes.

- · Students with an established IEP or ISP -OR-
- · Income eligible and

Transferring from a public/charter school -or-

Entering Kindergarten or first grade.

How do students apply?

- TTEF offers a prescreening application available at ttef-stl.org/moscholars. When a student "qualifies" they are automatically directed to the online application administered by FACTS.
- Upon approval from FACTS, TTEF will inform the families and school of choice of their award.
- Families may begin applying for the 2025 2026 academic year as of February 1st, 2025.

How will my school be paid?

- MOScholars is awarded via ClassWallet to the student for approved educational expenses.
- TTEF encourages families to pay school tuition and fees with MOScholars awards.
- Schools will create a ClassWallet account to receive direct payments for tuition from MOScholars families.

Should families continue to apply for other TTEF scholarships?

- Yes. Families should continue to apply for all TTEF's scholarships (both new and renewal).
- Should TTEF award a student and the same student earns a MOScholars award, TTEF will remove the TTEF scholarship.
- Siblings of MOScholars may continue on a TTEF award.




