It is my great honor to announce to the Duchesne community that senior **Ailsa Ide** was recently awarded the status of National Merit Semifinalist. I received the news last week but was sworn to secrecy until the National Merit Scholarship Corporation announced all of the winners on Wednesday, the 11th. Ailsa earned her status by performing exceptionally well on last year's PSAT, and she now has the opportunity to compete for highly selective scholarships.

The press release from the NMSC states that their goals include, "honoring the nation's scholastic champions and encouraging the pursuit of academic excellence." The group of semifinalists represents "less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors" and includes "the highest scoring entrants in each state." Less than one percent is an astounding number. In my short tenure as principal, Ailsa is the first Pioneer to earn this recognition. For those of us who know Ailsa, and especially for those of us lucky enough to teacher her, it also makes perfect sense that she would be included in this extremely rare company.

Now that Ailsa is a semifinalist, she has the opportunity to compete for multiple scholarships, including scholarships from the National Merit Scholarship Corporation and various corporate sponsored scholarships. Additionally, "about 150 colleges and universities are expected to finance some 3,600 college-sponsored Merit Scholarships awards for Finalists who will attend the sponsor institution."

As a school we couldn't be happier for or prouder of Ailsa. If you see her, wish her luck (that she certainly won't need) as she pursues these Finalist scholarships.
